RESOLUTIONS

8/21-12-74

These resolutions were collectively accepted and passed in the General Body meeting of Co-ordination Committee of Central Govt Employees Jammu held before the office of Controller of Accounts Jammu. Shri Hardyal Singh Rehbar presided over the meeting.

1. The co-ordination Committee fully sympathise with the workers of All India Defence Accounts Employees Association, struggling for the just demands as:-

- i. Immediate cancellation of all out of turn transfer orders served at Securdarbad, Kanpur and Kirki.
- ii. No transfer of any employee shall be made against his wish and repatriation transfers to choice station on Govt Expenses shall be ordered.

2. The committee condemns the attitude of Jammu and Kashmir Govt adopted for the move to order promotion without considering seniority or merit in respect of six woman teachers. In the absence of proper promotion policy pick and choose method is being adopted causing frustration in the minds of teachers. The committee demands that immediate intervention shall be made by Station authorities to safeguard the interest of woman teachers.

3. It is highly urged that central Govt shall pay the due installment of DA to the workers in full scrapping the black ordinance of wage freeze. The Govt has fully failed to hold the price line and those workers who have been given already retrograde scales are badly affected in these hard days. The committee finds no reasons to curb the inflationary tendencies through taxing the salaried class and urge to raise the financial resources through recovering the due arrears of income taxes to the tune of 800/- Crores from monopoly capital and electric bills more than Rs. 150/- Crores.

NATIONAL CO-ORDINATION COMMITTEE FOR RAILWAY MEN'S STRUGGLE - TN
DEVILOUS
REVOLUTION

This Public meeting held under the auspices of the NCCRS/Tiruchirappalli in observance of "Anti-Victimisation and Trade Union Rights Day" deploras the delay in the implementation of the assurances and promises made in and outside the Parliament that all the employees victimised for participation in May, 1974 strike would be taken except those found guilty of violence and sabotage even after 6 months after the withdrawal of the strike. In Tiruchirappalli Division, a single casual labour, substitute or temporary workman has not been taken back to duty. A large number of appeals have been rejected by the appellate authorities. None of these employees have been taken back with violence or sabotage or causing loss to public property.

While keeping these men out of job a large number of persons have been recruited by questionable methods and the administration has kept the employees as casual for periods ranging upto 15 years and is taking undue haste in conferring all the privileges to the newly recruited personnel.

All the employees are watching this process with serious indignation and dismay. This meeting makes an earnest appeal to the authorities to understand the psychological effect the present policy will have on the Railwaymen and hasten to change the present policy in accordance with the advice tendered by Shri V.V. Giri, the former President of India in the interests of industrial peace and orderly progress of the nation by immediately reinstating all the employees who have been terminated, removed, dismissed, compulsorily retired before attaining the age of age or otherwise discharged for their participation in May 1974 strike, condoning the break in services, and doing away with the division sought to be created as strikers and non-strikers.

2. This public meeting held under the auspices of the NCCRS/Tiruchirappalli in observance of "Anti-Victimisation and Trade Union Rights Day" resolves to carry on the struggle until all the victimised employees are re-instated, break-in-service condoned, all forms of victimisation vacated and a settlement is reached between the Railwaymen and the Railway Ministry. Further resolves to strengthen the unity achieved during the strike, to preserve and advance Trade Union Rights at any cost. This meeting appeals to the Railwaymen to stand united and determined and make common cause with the rest of the working people for the amelioration of common problems.

3. This meeting demands payment of Dearness Allowances for every eight point 12 monthly average rise in cost of Living Index until the recommendation of the Pay Commission accepted by the Government that the entire structure should be revised when the cost of Living Index crosses 272 points average, is implemented.

4. This meeting deploras the policy of Wage Freeze and points out that this policy has not led to either stabilising the prices or bringing them down but on the other hand the rise in prices since the promulgation of the Ordinance in July is phenomenal. This meeting appeals to the Government to review its policy on the basis of realities of the situation and revoke the compulsory Savings & Deposit Act, 1974.

B. SPECIAL RESOLUTIONS
(Based on Demand No.9)

This meeting notes with deep regret that contrary to Public assurances and commitments by the leaders of the Government including the President of India, the Prime Minister, the Railway Minister and the Home Minister in Parliament and outside, repression against the Railwaymen the central (P & T, Income-tax etc.), LIC, and State Government Employees in connection with their recent peaceful strike actions at different times in the year 1974, continues unabated.

This meeting strongly condemns this suppression of trade Union and other democratic rights of the Working masses of the Country and demands that:-

- a) All the Railwaymen removed during last-strike of May '74 should immediately be re-instated and breaks-in-service imposed on striking Rly. workers be withdrawn immediately.
- b) The punitive measures such as suspension etc. imposed on the LIC trade Union Workers should immediately be withdrawn and the victimised staff be allowed to resume duties all at once.
- c) All the penal transfers made to some of the Railways, P & T, and State Government employees' trade Union workers should be withdrawn immediately and the staff transferred be brought back to their original place.
- d) It further demands that the Government should immediately enter to negotiations with the NCCRS and representatives of the Central and State Govt. Employees so that settlement of all of their outstanding disputes is arrived at without any delay.
