SPEECH AT 34th CONGRESS OF AITUC

(Madras, 7-12 August 1990)

by Ibrahim ZAKARIA, General Secretary, WFTU

On behalf of the World Federation of Trade Unions, I have great pleasure to convey to the 34th Congress of the AITUC our most fraternal greetings of international solidarity and to wish your Congress all success.

The WFTU highly appreciates the close cooperation and active support given by the AITUC to the development of our international activity and the important role the AITUC has always played, as a founding member of the WFTU, in promoting trade union cooperation and joint action regionally and internationally.

The WFTU highly assesses the important gains and achievements of the united actions and struggles led by the AITUC and the trade union movement in India in defence of the rights and interests of the working people.

In particular, the WFTU welcomes the proposals before the Parliament of India to statutorily guarantee the right to work and to adopt legislation on workers' participation in management, as important achievements of the Indian trade union movement. The WFTU also notes that a bipartite committee including representatives of all national trade union centres is now working on the new Industrial Relations Bill and that this Committee has become a forum for joint

action by the Indian trade union movement. These developments reflect the growing role of the Indian trade union movement in the economy and society and they open up new perspectives for further progress in the struggle for the rights and interests of the working people. They show the growing awareness that the participation of the working people and trade unions should be regarded as a vital element in harnessing the human and material resources of nations for the purposes of economic and social development.

Such positive trends are particularly significant in the present world trade union situation. In many countries and regions, organised efforts are being made to weaken and marginalise the trade unions.

The world trade union movement as it enters the decade of the 1990s is facing a complex situation as well as challenging tasks of renewal and development. Some circles have made big attempts to present this complex situation and crisis in a one-sided way, alleging that the difficulties are there only for the WFTU affiliates in Central and Eastern Europe. From such a one-sided view, they even forecast the imminent collapse of the World Federation of Trade Unions. I can assure you that their hopes are absolutely misplaced.

The WFTU and its affiliates and friends are, as you are aware, now preparing for the 12th World Trade Union Congress. An in-depth review of the world trade union situation will be made at that Congress and we expect the participation of trade union delegations, irrespective of affiliation, from all continents. The Congress is expected to be a world trade union forum for dialogue and action.

We hope that through a fraternal dialogue and exchange of experiences, the trade union delegations at the 12th World Trade Union Congress could identify the main challenges and tasks in the present period. An objective assessment of the concrete realities in each country and region is important in this respect. In the past, we have been carried away by trying to project certain world views based only on certain regional experiences. We all welcome the positive developments in the world situation and are happy that there is a growing consciousness that the cold war must end and that problems should be solved through international cooperation and not armed confrontation.

However, many are likely to question whether the positive trends will remain and will become universal. Already, there are voices which continue in the same old ways of confrontation and claim that capitalism has emerged triumphant from the cold war and that socialism has collapsed.

There is now an organised campaign to use the developments in East Europe to intensify the ideological offensive against trade unions and to denounce all those who demand that economic policies should have a social content. The mistakes made in East Europe which led to economic decline and stagnation had a number of reasons, one of which was the failure to involve the working people and trade unions in the management of society and the total domination of the bureaucracy negating genuine democratic development. The trade unions which are being renewed in these countries therefore insist on their independence vis-à-vis governments and political parties and demand the true enforcement of the trade union rights

which were accepted in principle earlier but were not seriously implemented.

Experience teaches us to reject over-simplified assumptions and solutions like those offered by the International Monetary Fund of total liberalisation of the economy, privatisation and deregulation. The reasons why the decade of the 1980s became a lost decade for most developing countries show the bankruptcy of the economic packages offered by the IMF and the ideologues from the Group of Seven industrialised capitalist countries. Capitalism has not been able to solve the immense problems of economic and social development and especially the problems of unequal inter-state economic relations resulting in the drainage of huge resources from the developing countries. What is therefore needed is a non-dogmatic approach, an approach oriented to human development and not just economic growth in pockets, an approach which could link economic policies with the achievement of basic human rights.

We believe that the world trade union movement, mobilising all the vast talents and experiences of the trade unions in all countries and social systems, can make an important contribution to the collective efforts needed to formulate such a democratic orientation to economic and social policies. Your vast experience in India is especially important in this context.

The draft document for the 12th World Trade Union Congress which is entitled "Trade Union strategies for the 1990s" has brought together a number of important issues for the common reflection of the trade union movement. These include the problems

of technological and structural change, their impact on the composition of the working class and also on trade union membership, and the new problems of trade union unity based on democracy, pluralism and joint defence of the interests of the working people.

I am confident that your Congress, upholding the great traditions of the Indian trade union movement, would effectively contribute to the search for new approaches for the renewal of the trade union movement in the new situation and also help towards the renewal of the world trade union movement as well. The challenges before us are unprecedented. In this year of the centenary of the May Day and the 45th anniversary of the foundation of the WFTU, we are sure that the fundamental principles of our great movement of international unity and solidarity remain valid and that they continue to guide us to find the right solutions to the current challenges.

With these words, I wish the Congress all success.

This is for your information that Madras city, the venue of the Conference, is connected by air with Delhi Bombay and Calcutta by daily flights. The weather expected to be very warm.


