ARRANGEMENTS FOR STAY: Members of the AITUC Working Committee and General Council and Delegates to the T.U. Convention will be accommodated at the SIKH GURUDWARA, NEAR KOHINOOR MILLS, VINCENT ROAD, DADAR, BOMBAY. This place is about 12 minutes' walk from the Dadar station on the Central Railway. Delegates arriving by Central and Western Railway trains should alight at Dadar and those getting down at Bombay V.T. should proceed to the lodging place by taxi.

Delegates are notified in advance that SMOKING WILL BE STRICTLY PROHIBITED within the premises where lodging arrangements have been made.

The venue of the meetings and the convention, i.e., SHIVAJI PARK, is within easy distance from the lodging place.

REPRESENTATION IN T.U. CONVENTION: Unions are assigned the following the quota of delegates:

MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 2nd MARCH 1964 at AITUC OFFICE AT 6.00 P.M.

Present Com. Satish Loomba and Com. K.G. Sriwastava, Secretary, AITUC, Comrades of Delhi State Trade Union Congress of AITUC under the leadership of Com. A.C. Nanda, General Secretary.

Arrangements in connection with the lodging, Boarding and other ^{arrangements} in connection with the 'Satyagraha' of Toilers on 6th April 1964 were discussed.

1. It was found that the Government or Semi-Government land will not be available for setting-up of a camp for over 1000 comrades who are expected to participate in the Satyagraha. Comrades will start arriving in the city from 2nd April evening as the National Campaign Committee is scheduled to meet on 3rd morning. By 4th April full quota of Satyagrahis have been called in Delhi. On 5th April a meeting will have to be called of all Satyagrahis. Arrangements for their stay is required till at least 11th April, though the number will dwindle down on each following day. Other arrangements viz. volunteers, transport and fooding can be thought of only after lodging is fixed up.

2. It was agreed that (a) the possibilities of getting Dharmshalas and Sarais in Paharganj and Chandni Chowk should be explored. As the marriage season will on by that time this booking should be done from now on and on a pucca basis, (b) we must also be in the look-out for any private plot of land where tents can be pitched and a camp established for this purpose, and (c) the possibilities of getting the lawns of 4 Asoka Road and 21 Bakabganj Road should be explored.

3. Item (a) and (b) will be undertaken by Delhi STUC comrades and item (c) by Com. K.G. Sriwastava.

4. A committee consisting of the following General Council members from Delhi and as many Secretariat members of AITUC as are available in Delhi, with Com. K.G. Sriwastava as Convener was formed to take up the responsibility for this work.

5. As regards lodging Com. A.C. Nanda, Com. Prem Sagar Gupta and Com. R.C. Sharma will meet again in AITUC Office at 13.00 hrs. on 6 March 1964 to find out the progress in the work and decide about the lodging arrangements.

6. Com. A.C. Nanda ^{raised} arranged the issue of publicity. Arrangements for this campaign and how far the AITUC Centre will spend on it. Com. K.G. Sriwastava stated that as a STUC a local committee should chalk out its plan of publicity and then only this committee will further discuss it.
